

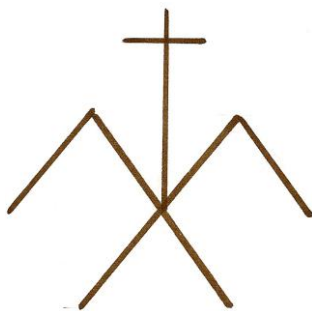
MASONS' MARKS

12.



The Mason's mark was used to denote either, which mason had worked on a particular stone, or that the work around this stone had been checked and passed by that particular mason.

The most common one was the cross, seen on many of our columns between the nave and the two half aisles. The marks shown below are more complicated versions, but no matter what the design was, they were all made with a masonry chisel and mallet.
