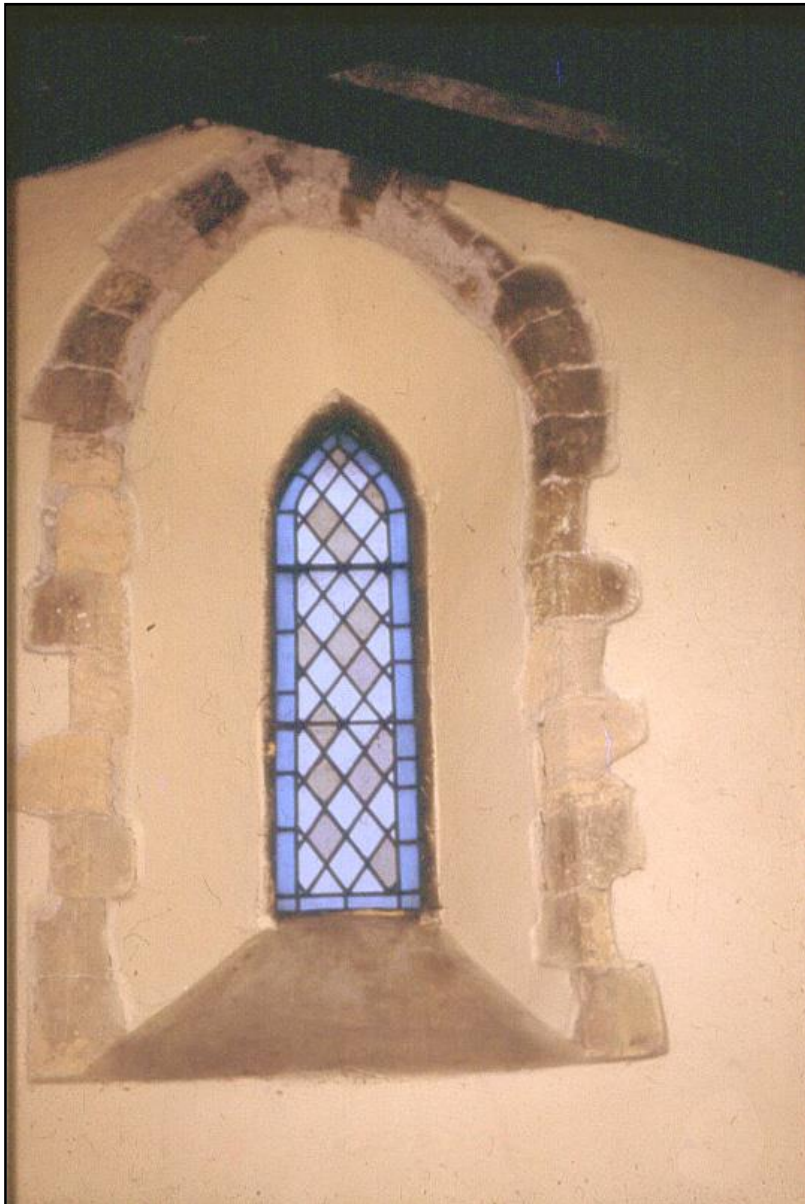


## LANCET WINDOW in Quex Chapel

This is one of the oldest windows in the church. It was inserted in about 1250 and is high up in the west wall of Quex Chapel. It was placed there to give extra light, particularly at the end of the day.

There was a suggestion that it might once have lit an upper chamber for the priest, but this is highly unlikely. It would have intruded on the east window of the chapel. It is also clear from the Churchwardens' accounts that the priest lived in one of the houses near the church, probably lodging with an elderly parishioner, who also did his washing and fed him.
