

GEORGE FRAMPTON - A. R. A.

The STUDIO Vol VI – 1896

An interviewer visited George Frampton in his studio in 1896. The article appeared in 'The Studio', a Journal of the time with numerous interesting articles covering all aspects of art and design.

Frampton's replies to his questions are recorded verbatim, so after describing the sculptor's studio, he then records his questions and George's answers. He asked George if he had done much work on domestic buildings.

"A great deal," he said, "more than I could remember offhand. I have done a good deal of modelled stucco work, chiefly for gables, grotesques and foliage.

"I was engaged upon some sgraffito work for a house in Birchington at the time Rossetti died there."
